relating to education and study

"She has strong academic results from her university."

**2 curriculum**

the subjects studied in a school or course

"The curriculum includes science, maths and English."

**3 scholarship**

money given to a student to help pay for their education

"She received a scholarship to study abroad."

**4 enrol**

to officially join a course or institution

"He decided to enrol in an English language course."

**5 assessment**

a test or evaluation of someone's ability

"The teacher gave a written assessment at the end of term."

**6 graduate**

to successfully complete a degree or course

"She will graduate from university next year."

**7 lecture**

a talk given to a group of students

"The professor gave an interesting lecture on history."

**8 semester**

half of an academic year

"The new semester starts in September."

**9 assignment**

a piece of work given to students

"He stayed up late to finish his assignment."

**10 compulsory**

required by rules or law

"Mathematics is a compulsory subject in most schools."

**11 tuition**

teaching, especially private teaching

"She paid for extra tuition to improve her English."

**12 qualify**

to successfully complete training for a job

"He studied hard to qualify as a doctor."

**13 undergraduate**

a student studying for their first degree  
"He is an undergraduate at the local university."

**14 postgraduate**

a student studying after their first degree  
"She is doing postgraduate research in medicine."

**15 thesis**

a long piece of writing based on research  
"He spent two years writing his thesis."

**16 vocational**

relating to skills needed for a particular job  
"He chose a vocational course in mechanics."

**17 literacy**

the ability to read and write  
"Improving literacy is a priority in many countries."

**18 numeracy**

the ability to understand and use numbers  
"Good numeracy skills are important in business."

**19 continuous**

happening without stopping  
"The course involves continuous assessment throughout the year."

**20 research**

careful study to find new information  
"The university is known for its medical research."

**21 faculty**

a department in a university  
"She works in the faculty of engineering."

**22 certificate**

an official document showing you completed a course  
"She received a certificate after finishing the course."

**23 discipline**

a subject of study  
"Physics is a challenging academic discipline."

**24 practical**

involving real situations rather than theory  
"Students must complete practical training in a hospital."

**25 seminar**

a small group discussion class at university  
"She attended a seminar on modern literature."

# The Benefits of Learning a Second Language

Learning a second language has become increasingly important in today's globalised world. Research shows that bilingual individuals enjoy a range of cognitive, social and economic advantages over those who speak only one language.

From a cognitive perspective, studies have demonstrated that learning a new language improves memory, attention and problem-solving skills. This is because the brain must work harder to manage two language systems simultaneously, which strengthens neural connections over time. Some researchers have even suggested that bilingualism may delay the onset of dementia by several years.
